Ruins of the Kaga Maeda Clan Residence

The residence began with the grant of 60,000 "tsubo" (about 200,000 square meters) of land in February 1679 by Ietsuna Tokugawa, the fourth shogun of the Edo Period, to Tsunanori, the fourth head of the Kaga clan counting from its founder, Toshiie Maeda. After several additional grants, the property eventually expanded to over 217,000 "tsubo" (over 700,000 square meters; the area shown on the map). It was used for stays, hunting, and strolls by the members of the Maeda family during their lord's mandatory visits to Edo, the shogun's capital, every other year.

Oji Shindo



The road opened in 1888 when the residents of Itabashi Town raised contributions for the construction of a road to the industrial area in Oji, Kita City. Official name of the road is "Oji Itabashi Kando".
